Act independently and in collaboration with physiotherapy team to assess, analyse and provide a clinical diagnosis for all injured players to determine their need for physiotherapy intervention. Act independently to plan, implement, evaluate, treat and progress player care to maximise rehabilitation potential. Manage caseload of players effectively and efficiently. Maintain patient documentation, records and accurate statistical information to reflect care provided and meet professional standards. Enter all clinical data in the WRU electronic medical note keeping system. Communicate and make recommendations to maximise player care and promote multidisciplinary working. Assist in developing, implementing and maintaining appropriate clinical guidelines ensuring clinical effectiveness to optimise player care. Assist in the preseason-screening programme.
